# **Rhyme Awareness**

Clearly read this book to your child to increase rhyme awareness, tap, clap or nod to emphasise the rhyming words (tree/me, sand/land, song/along, butterfly/sky)

As you read you will model the following **oral language grammar** and **concepts**:

2 - 3 years	3 – 4 years
Action words (verbs) "march", flits, wriggles, trips,	Location words (prepositions) close, across,
chirps, hangs, slip, slide, lands"	along, upon,
The action verbs are supported by symbols; use	
gestures to make these words more concrete and	
easy to understand

There are also wordless pages which allow for labelling, discussion, predictions and inferences - a great opportunity to follow your child's lead in talking about the pictures.

Simply say, "Tell me about this picture" or ask "What are they doing" or "Where are they?" and "How do you know?" Wait and give your child plenty of time to respond and lead the conversation!

**After reading** Action words are the building blocks of early language. Use the book for inspiration; go into your garden or visit your local park to find local bugs, birds, shrubs, trees and flowers. Label everything! Which action words can you model and comment about as you watch bugs and birds make sounds and move through the environment?

- Dragonfly flits over the pond
- Earthworm wiggles in the earth
- Beetle **trips** across the sand
- Galah screeches in a tree
- Bees buzz, buzz, buzz!

Lots of Nursery rhymes and songs contain action verbs can be emphasised with gestures and movements:

- Open/shut them (Open, shut, clap, lay, creep)
- Hickory Dickory Dock (ran)
- Row, row, row your boat (row)
- Hey Diddle Diddle (jumped, laughed, ran)
- If You're Happy and You Know It (Clap your hands, stomp your feet)
- Everybody Clap (Everybody Sing, bow to your partner, turn around, rock your bear)
