

What a great way to create a story.

- Take a well-know old rhyme and give it new meaning.
- Use Australian characters and objects that are familiar.
- ► Give a reason for the story in the rhyme. "A party!"



BEFORE READING...

The first time you tell the story talk about:

- - ► How this sounds like a rhyme you know.
 - ► The picture on the cover of the kangaroo and owl taking apples to sell.
 - A market is a place where people take things they grow to sell.

WHILE READING...



- ► Read it straight through so you can use the rhyme to keep your child interested
- ▶ Don't give the surprise at the end away till the end but...
- Build up the suspense when the animals are missing.

AFTER READING..



- Go back to explore the pages for the platypus, crocodile and quokka. Now what they were doing makes sense. They were making a party!
- Point out all interesting things in the book and learn some new names and the groups they are in like vegetables, fruits, and animals.

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
